**Inspiration Corner** - LLUH has two resource teams, and three response teams comprised of faculty, students, and staff, from the School of Public Health, School of Behavioral Health, and the Institute for Community Partnerships who are creating resources to be distributed to the community in multiple languages in order to ensure that our most vulnerable community members have access to credible information on Covid-19, shelter in place, and where to go for resources. The form allows community members in need of resources to make a request with follow-up from Community Health Workers and LLUH Students. Community members can request non-emergency related items and the teams are working, through various volunteer and community organizations and collaborations, to respond to the requests for help.
